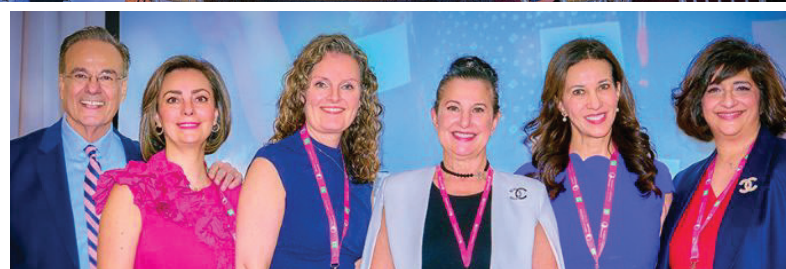

Dementia and Alzheimer's: Shaping the Future of Clinical Practice

Description:

Dementia is generally characterized by a decline in cognitive abilities, including thinking, memory, and reasoning. Alzheimer's disease (AD), the most prevalent form of dementia, accounts for 70-80% of all cases. Alzheimer's disease poses a significant public health challenge, requiring ongoing research and comprehensive approaches to prevention, care, and support for those affected. While there is no one specific root cause there is an understanding that lifestyle, behavioral, and medical interventions is key to prevention. A compelling amount of scientific evidence has revealed that poor oral health was a risk factor for AD independent of age, gender, and laboratory measures and has identified that diseases related to tooth loss, dental caries, periodontal diseases, gingivitis, and other diseases of the lip and oral mucosa were associated with a higher risk of AD. Bidirectional care integration between dental and medical providers may best help mitigate patient's risk. Discover evidence-based, safe strategies not only to improve your own brain health but to help your patients extend their brain span, reinforcing our role as healthcare providers.

Objectives:

- Recognize the scope of bacteria, yeast, and viruses in the development of Alzheimer's disease
- Discover how heart health, hearing loss, genetics, insulin resistance, diet, exercise and sleep impact the risk of cognitive decline
- Realize "red flag" risk factors that can be found on patient's medical histories and how dental providers can help
- Ensure better brain health with treatments for sleep disruptors like apnea

Anne Rice: Anne is a clinical dental hygienist, speaker, writer, and consultant. She received her preceptor for the Bale/Donnen method, is a Certified Dementia Practitioner, and a Longevity Specialist with the Alzheimer's Research and Prevention Foundation, where she has developed curriculum. She is a fellow with AAOSH, on their advisory board and is certified in the Buteyko breathing method. Anne published her manuscript Alzheimer's Disease and Oral-Systemic Health for Frontiers and her column for RDH magazine focusing on oral systemic health and is on their 2024 editorial advisory board. She was chosen as a recipient of the 2024 Sunstar award of distinction. Anne has been included in an International Consortium of a diverse network of brain researchers, clinicians and institutions who support Alzheimer's prevention. Her consulting has brought her to Weill Cornell Medical Center's Alzheimer's Prevention Clinic, Florida Atlantic College Center for Brain Health, and the Atria Institute.

Keys to Master Ceramic Veneers

Description:

This lecture focuses on the latest protocols for ceramic veneer restorations. The program provides an overview of the knowledge and practical skills necessary to perfect ceramic veneer restorations, covering material selection, diagnostic and treatment planning for esthetic cases using ceramic veneers. Key concepts on the latest procedures for preparation, impression, and cementation of veneers will be covered. Participants will gain an understanding of the critical differences among various preparations and ceramic materials, enabling them to confidently select them. Additionally, attendees will learn how to incorporate diagnostic mock-ups into their daily practice as a reliable choice for treatment planning, effective communication with patients and labs, and time-saving during the preparation and provisional phases of complex cases. Participants will learn the latest techniques on ceramic veneers and be ready to immediately apply them to enhance their clinical performance.

- Understand the treatment planning of esthetic cases and designing the smile.
- Compare the best ceramic material for veneers restorations and understand how to select the appropriate type of ceramic.
- Overview of veneer preparation protocols: classic versus modern preparations techniques

Key Concepts in Digital Workflows: When, Why, How?

Description:

The development and improvement of digital technologies such as CBCT, intraoral scanning and CAD/CAM, continue to simplify our daily diagnostic and treatment procedures. Particularly in implant dentistry, the integration of these tools has helped us improve the quality and efficiency of our treatments.

In this time of constant evolution, clinicians are frequently confronted with the same questions: When should we use a digital workflows? When should we stick to traditional workflows? Or is there a possibility to utilize both? What pathway will give us the most satisfying outcomes?

The purpose of this lecture is to provide clinicians with an overview and systematic approach to the different stages of digital workflows in implant dentistry. We will outline fundamental digital dentistry terminologies, the tools required, and restorative pathways in a simplified and practical manner.

Objectives:

- Understand the fundamentals of digital workflows, including communication strategies and essential tools
- Examine the similarities and differences between digital and traditional restorative pathways
- Discuss potential challenges associated with different pathways for patients requiring dental implants.

Dr. Renata Camino: Dr. Renata Camino Navarro received her DDS from Universidad Intercontinental in Mexico City. After spending a couple years in private practice Dr. Camino made the decision to pursue an advanced training in the field of prosthodontics which she completed at the University of North Carolina - Chapel Hill / Adams school of Dentistry earning her prosthodontics certificate and a Master of Science, followed by a Fellowship in Dental Implantology. She served as an assistant professor in the department of prosthodontics at the same institution, where her role involved didactic and clinical instruction in the pre-doctoral and graduate programs. Horses vs. Zebras: Interpretation of Common Radiographic Abnormalities

Description:

Radiographic abnormalities regularly seen by an oral and maxillofacial radiologist may pose a diagnostic challenge to other clinicians. In this presentation, common radiographic abnormalities will be reviewed and other lesions that may mimic or be mistaken for common abnormalities will be discussed in a case presentation format.

Objectives:

- Describe the radiographic features of abnormalities commonly encountered in dental practice.
- Formulate a differential diagnosis for common radiographic abnormalities seen in dental practice
- Recognize radiographic features of other abnormalities that may mimic common lesions

The Implant Minded Dental Extraction in the Age of Implant Immediacy

Description:

This session will review how to set the stage appropriately for dental implants by performing mindful extractions. In addition, the concept of socket preservation will be reviewed to ensure an understanding of why, when, and how. Immediate implants and temporization will also be reviewed. As such, whether surgically inclined or not, this session is important for all clinicians in daily practice as it reveals what's required to ensure simpler and predictable treatment solutions.

Objectives:

- understand the classification of extraction sockets and how to manage them
- review the materials and technique of socket grafting
- appreciate the effects of implant immediacy
